- The BSMM has 35 official members, 34 specialists of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine and 1 neurologist.
- The educational courses of Manual Medicine are organized with the support of the Medical University of Varna and the diplomas issued at the end are signed by the Rector of the university & the instructors.
- The National Course of Manual Medicine comprises of 3 courses of 7 days. The total number of education hours is 168 (*working towards 300 hours.*)
- The attendance of the 2013 educational course of Manual Medicine was 14 doctors. We hope some of them will join BSMM in the future.
- The Annual Meeting of BSMM took place on the 28th of September 2013 in Rouse. The major topic was the thoracic spine – diagnostics and therapy.

Major problems of the Bulgarian Society of Manual Medicine (BSMM):

1. In 2013 the loss of our Vice-President has made the organization of the National Education course of Manual Medicine extremely difficult. We managed to continue the education process without delays, but we lack sufficient number of experienced teachers. That is the main reason for us not being able to increase the number of education hours up to 300, as FIMM demands.
2. Lack of sufficient funding of the Manual Medicine procedures. Only manual mobilizations are paid by the health insurance system and under certain case limitations. This fact decreases the number of doctors who wish to study and practice Manual Medicine.
3. There are no strict State Regulations for the professional qualifications. Hundreds of non-MDs are declaring freely that they are Specialists of Manual Medicine. This brings a lot of confusion in the patients and discredits the Manual Medicine itself.

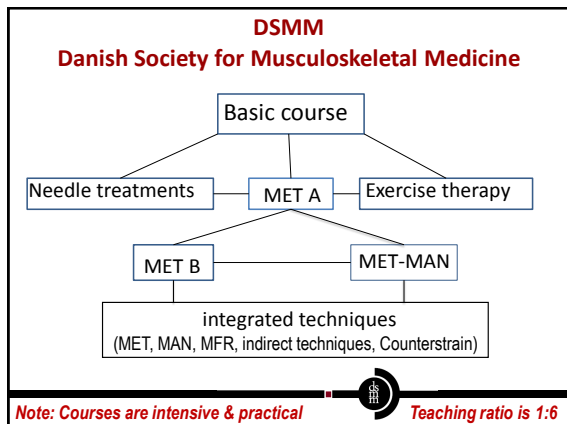

European MM Guidelines in UEMS website will be notable achievement in history of European MM.

The whole world needs clearness – what is what.

I hope, this act helps to reserve term "Manual Medicine" only for MDs, educated by FIMM and ESSOMM curriculum and excludes possibilities that Chiropractor from Canada could present himself and his "Trigenics" under the name of Manual Medicine or American massagers could use name Manual Medicine for their Association etc.

I hope, this document will give exact understanding in basic or principled differences in multiple disciplines – all using joint manipulations:

1. between **Manual Medicine** and **Manual Therapy** disciplines and federations activities (e.g. IFOMPT: International Federation of Orthopaedic Manipulative Physical Therapists: www.ifompt.com)
2. between Manual Therapy in the frame of Manual Medicine (FIMM/ESSOMM) and Manual Therapy in the frame of White book on **Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine**

3. between **Manual Medicine** and **Osteopathy**
4. between **Manual Medicine** and **Chiropraxy**
5. between **Manual Medicine** and **Naprapathy**
6. between **Manual Medicine** and **Etiopathie** (Christian Tredaniel "Histoire du reboutement. Du reboutement à l'étiopathie.")

I would like to express some thoughts about Guideline, version 2.6.

Name of MM discipline and great confusion in this field.

1.1 Typical medical specialties names

As we could see on UEMS' website: <http://www.uems.net/index.php?id=30>, most of medical specialties/disciplines have their names by of one organ and disorders with ending "-logy" (Greek: "logia"): neurology, cardiology etc.

1.2 Untypical medical specialties names

Few medical disciplines have names - not by organ, but by describing the character of physicians activity: Emergency Medicine, Kind of treatment procedures (water, electricity etc.): Physical Medicine Aim of activity: Rehabilitation Medicine Patient's action: Occupational Medicine, Sports Medicine "Instruments" of physicians activity: Manual Medicine Others: Public Health Medicine

1.3 Non-medical practitioners and organizations using the name Manual Medicine

1.3.1 Trigenics

As you already know by my last report about Manual Medicine in Estonia - here we have experience about different non-medical groups who introducing themselves as representatives of Manual Medicine. One most expressive example is a Canadian chiropractor ... who practices in Estonia also and he is the President of Estonian Manual Medicine and Chiropractic Association. He introduce himself as author of original therapy-method "**TRIGENICS**" or **Myoneural Medicine**. He is Director of Myoneural Institute in Canada ... He also introduce himself as NMD, DO, DC, DAC, CCRD, CCSP, CFIS, PhD and in Estonian website (English version) he introduce "Trigenics" under heading "Manual Medicine"

1.3.2 Scandinavian Joint Mobilization Therapy and Manual Acupuncture

On Estonian website [this chiropractor] states that Estonian Manual Medicine and Chiropractic Association based on American Manual Medicine Association (AMMA) ...
"based upon Contemporary Naprapathic Manual Medicine, therapeutic passive exercise, and the manual medicine procedures and protocols and Manual Acupuncture. The AMMA NBCE program in manual therapy has the highest application standards and National Board Examination testing of any examination offered in the field of manual medicine. The AMMA acupuncture NBCE is the only examination process for practitioners who have been specifically trained in the science and techniques of medical acupuncture. Through an evidence-based exam, rather than a traditional Chinese medicine (TCM) examination process, the AMMA provides two levels of National Board Certification, Certified Practical Acupuncturist (P.Ac.) and NBC Diplomate Acupuncturist (D.Ac.)."

1.4 Term/name "Manual Therapy" used quite widely as general/ universal name for all kind treatments made by hand.

E.g. in Estonian Encyclopedia (1992) could see under the term **Manual therapy** following: "Treatment by the hands, oldest sort of manual therapy is massage; most spread are: Japanese shiatsu, Acupuncture, Zone-massage of food, Rolfing massage, Feldenkrais method, Alexander method, Lymph massage, Point-massage, Muscle-massage. Classical methods of manual therapy is osteopathy and chiropractic."

1.5 FIMM incorporates societies with very different names:

Manual medicine, Manual musculo-skeletal medicine, Myoskeletal medicine, Manual therapy, Orthopedic medicine, Orthopedic and osteopathic manual medicine, Manuelle Medizin/Chirotherapie, Medicina Fisica e Riabilitativa, Ortho-Manuel medicine, Osteopathy, Arthrokinematics

1.6 FIMM has different names in English (Manual Musculoskeletal Medicine) and in French and German languages (Manual medicine).

1. To avoid above-mentioned mess in connection with term "Manual Medicine", it will be good to try to move with our specialty-name to maximum clearness and uniformity.
2. It will be correct to use for one medical discipline/specialist/ organization – only one name. Neurology is neurology and cardiology and is cardiology all over the world (short and clear).
3. Presumably FIMM and even UEMS and WHO have no possibilities to interdict use of term "Manual Medicine" for all non-medical practitioners (in Europe, in USA). Even - to interdict use of name "Medicine" in connection with non-medical practitioners.
4. This guideline is just a suitable moment, after describing all variety of names of discipline - to propose one name for our discipline. Why it may be not based on the main object/organ in our discipline : vertebrae. "Vertebrology" has used time to time already earlier. And physicians name - vertebrologist – also quite suitable. This will be clear possibility to differentiate MD-s from non-MD-s.

5. Of course, in connection with vertebral disorders - there are problems also in lymph and blood circulation, nervous system, muscles, ligaments, periost, fascias, inner-organs etc., but it is not needful to list all organs, systems, aims and "instruments" in the name of one discipline. All this could list in frame definition of discipline, not in the name.

For example - heart diseases also may give rise to other organ disorders, but this is not reflected in the discipline name.

I shall continue soon with other proposals.

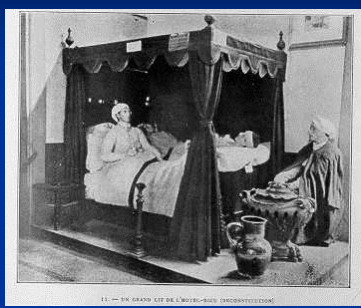

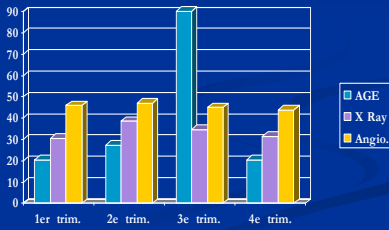

Hong Kong Institute of Musculoskeletal Medicine (HKIMM)


- Hong Kong Institute of Musculoskeletal Medicine (HKIMM) was found in 2005. Up to May 2013, we have a total of fifty-five (55) members, of which eight are fellows including fellows by examination, honorary and foundation fellows. The other forty-five are members or associate members.
- The Institute has accomplished a train of education commitments in the past one year. The second certificate course of practical musculoskeletal medicine (CPMM) was well received by the participants. Apart from local medical practitioners, we have primary care doctors from Macau attending this course. The certificate course focuses on common musculoskeletal problems. It helps the participants to acquire skills which are necessary to make diagnoses and to provide management including but not limiting to manual skills, regenerative injection therapy and rehabilitation exercises.

Hong Kong Institute of Musculoskeletal Medicine (HKIMM)

- The institute was invited by the Stand Tall project to provide musculoskeletal ultrasound training to doctors from Mainland. The Stand Tall project was aimed to provide comprehensive rehabilitation training to medical personnel in Sichuan Province, China after the devastating earthquake in 2008. The institute was also invited by the Macao General Practitioners Association to deliver musculoskeletal workshops at Macao. The workshop incorporated theoretical as well as practical elements. Clinical applications were illustrated with live demonstration.
- HKIMM organized overseas training courses for our members. We had sent two groups of members (total ten) to join the American Association of Orthopedic Medicine (AAOM) Mexican prolotherapy workshops. One was held at Guadalajara, Mexico in November 2012. Another one was held at Cancun, Mexico in February 2013. Both workshops provided valuable practical experience with guidance by mentors from AAOM.

Hong Kong Institute of Musculoskeletal Medicine (HKIMM)

- In July 2013, we had another scientific meeting with AAOM. In addition to local faculty, we are honored to have Dr. Tom Raven, one of the most experienced prolotherapists in American and Dr. Steve Fleck, a renowned scientist on exercise physiology to share their expertise at our Scientific Meeting. Our Institute also invited the world known Musculoskeletal Ultrasound teacher, Dr. Tom Clark, to hold two teaching workshops. The first one in June 2013 was tailored for the beginners. The second one in August will be an intermediate course for local and overseas doctors.
- In the coming year, we continue to provide training opportunities for our members. We shall run talks and workshops to update their knowledge, and to enhance the professional competence. We reckon the importance of multidisciplinary approach. We shall seek co-ordination of sister associations which share the common interest and passion in helping patients with musculoskeletal sufferings.

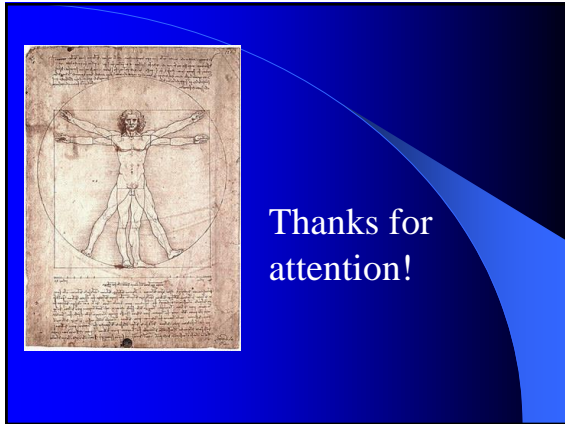

"Back to the Future"
FIMM National Society Report from New Zealand (PAGE 1 - PAST)

- The NZ Association of Musculoskeletal Medicine website records that in 1979 a NZ Government commissioned report on Chiropractic delivered recommendations that only Chiropractors and Osteopaths should practice Manual Therapy.
- In response the NZ Medical Association at the time formed a committee; Dr G Perry (Rheumatologist), Dr J.G.Abercrombie, Dr R Bernau, Dr C.M.Williamson and Dr D Carnachan (General Practitioners interested in Manual Therapy) to respond to this report. They highlighted deficiencies in the report and it was subsequently never enacted.
- This committee also acknowledged deficiencies in medical training of Doctors to examine and treat common musculoskeletal complaints with manual therapy. They formed the NZ Association of Musculoskeletal Medicine in 1980 with the aim of promoting & teaching Musculoskeletal Medicine in NZ.
- In its 1st year this new organization immediately attracted 40-50 members & after the 1st year 150 NZ Medical Practitioners. The inaugural conference was held in Rotorua in 1981 and NZAMSM became a member of the International Federation of Manual Therapy (FIMM) in the same year. In 1982 a combined meeting was held with the Australasian Association of Manual Therapy (AAMM) in Rotorua & strong links were forged between these two organizations that remain today.
- Photographs of the day show mostly men (from the Baby Boomers generation) willing to spend their weekends learning the skills of Musculoskeletal Medicine and having fun.

FIMM National Society Report from New Zealand (PAGE 2 – PRESENT)

- Today our membership has shrunk by attrition to around 50 mostly Baby Boomers. The deficiencies in our medical training of Doctors to exam and treat common musculoskeletal complaints are unchanged. This is a global problem as worldwide, medical schools allocate less than 10% of their curriculum to Musculoskeletal Medicine. The NZ medical graduate of today hails from so called Generation X, Y or Z and is more likely to be female. They graduate with a degree and debt in the form of a student loan. They enter a profession that demands ongoing professional development by attending approved post graduate activities, meeting with their peers regularly and reviewing their medical practice to be reaccredited and receive their annual registration. It doesn't look like fun.
- The outcome is many have gone overseas to more lucrative medical practice to pay off their loans and many stay away so that our workforce plugs the gap with graduates from overseas. Generation X, Y or Z are "harder nosed" than the Baby Boomers and seem less willing to spend their weekends voluntarily learning the science and art of Musculoskeletal Medicine at their own cost. They will attend paid post graduate training that helps towards their reaccreditation and their income. Even though it is relevant, interesting and dare I say it fun, Musculoskeletal Medicine does not fit these criteria.

FIMM National Society Report from New Zealand (PAGE 3 – FUTURE)

- There is change on the horizon in Australasia as a flood of medical graduates from increased medical school intakes finds difficulty training them in the traditional hospital training posts. The weight of numbers means that opportunities for NZ graduates to work in Australia will shrink as each country trains their own graduates first, which means that NZ graduates will be less likely to leave and the medical workforce will start to match the needs of the population.
- One of the needs of the aging population is medical practitioners with competency in Musculoskeletal Medicine. The challenge of the NZ Association of Musculoskeletal Medicine and its vocational progeny the Australasian Faculty of Musculoskeletal Medicine is for the Baby Boomers to pass the torch onto Generation X, Y or Z. Paid post graduate training would be a start but the same thinking and influence that limits the medical curriculum to spending less than 10% on Musculoskeletal Medicine makes this unlikely.
- So we press on, holding our scientific conferences alternate years with our Australian counterparts and providing educational sessions for our General Practice colleagues, ever hopeful that we will find kindred spirits in the audience and that the powers that be will finally see the logic and importance of fostering Musculoskeletal Medicine.


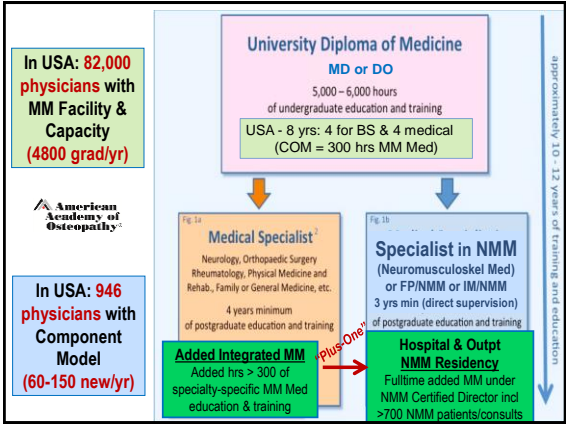
In the USA, the AAO is one of 18 Specialty Affiliates of the American Osteopathic Association (AOA)



- ▶ OMM Teaching Faculty in 37 universities/colleges teaching the **Capacity Model** (>300 hours)
 - Chairs meet 2-3X/year for curricular standards
- ▶ Specialty College for the **Component Model** in USA → Specialty in Neuromusculoskeletal Medicine
 - 36 Residency Programs (NMM; FP/NMM; IM/NMM; "Plus-One")
 - FP/NMM or IM/NMM are dually-certified in NMM & either Family Practice (FP) or Internal Medicine (IM) ; Plus-One leads to dual certification in any other specialty
- ▶ **Teachers:** MM Med other specialty colleges (& international)
- ▶ Collaborative **Research** Investigators in >80% of all Clinical Research in USA related to MM Medicine

Possibilities / Issues for MM in USA

- ▶ **AOA** greater interest in FIMM (80,000 members)
 - Possible health policy implications for/from FIMM
- ▶ Negotiations in USA for **unified residency match** and teaching for DO & MD residents would potentially present great challenges and great opportunities
 - Teaching MD graduates without basic facility level
 - Teaching MD residents that they prefer to capacity within time frame previously allotted
 - Question about credentialing, testing, recertifying in the 2 equal but parallel systems
- ▶ While need exists, **growth rate** may be exceeding capacity and numbers of teachers
