Bratislava

Bratislava is situated in the heart of Europe on the Danube Flatland between the Carpathian Mountains and the Alps. Two historical European trade routes met here: The Amber route connecting The Balic and Adriatic seas and the Danube route. Bratislava, Vienna and Budapest are situated at three point of triangle. It was inhabited by Skyts, Celts, Romans. The Bratislava fortification walls and castles were part of the frontier of the great Roman Empire called Limes Romanus. With the arrival of the Slavs in the 4th century in the area, extensive fortified settlements were built here. Among the oldest landmarks of Bratislava is the castle Devin, an important political and spiritual centre of the **Great Moravian Empire in the 9th century.** +

In the countryside around Bratislava there are historical vineyards. Wine had already been produced in this region by the Celts. It is a part of **the Little Carpathian Vineyards Path**. With the territory of 1000 ha it is the largest wineproducing area in Slovakia.

In 1405 Bratislava became an independent Free Royal Town. In 1465 the Hungarian King Mathias Corvinus established the University called Academia Istropolitana. In 1536, during the wars with Turks, Bratislava was pronounced the capital of the Hungarian-Austrian Empire. In the years 1563 – 1830, 11 Hungarian and Austrian Kings and 8 royal wives were crowned here. Maria Theresia among them. In 1537 the famous doctor and scolar A. T. B. Paracelsus visited the town. In 1638 the Russian Tzar Peter the Great came to Bratislava and studied ship building in the Bratislava port.

In the 18th and 19th centuries Mozart, Haydn, Liszt, Rubinstein held their concerts here. The composer J. N. Hummel was born in Bratislava.

In 1918 Bratislava became a part of Czechoslovakia. After peaceful splitting of Czechoslovakia in 1993 Bratislava became the capital of Slovakia. Slovakia has a population of 5,4 million and Bratislava 430 000 inhabitants. It is administrative centre and the seat of universities and academies and various scientific institutions. Bratislava is a lively city with a majority of young people with its typical charm and temperament. It has a very good opera and theatres, rich concert life and many sports facilities. The natural beauty of its countryside with hills, flatland, lakes and the rivers Danube and Morava provide good opportunities for both winter and summer sporting activities: tennis, squash, golf, hiking, wild water, rafting, ice hockey, horseriding, soccer, etc.

You can reach Bratislava by all kinds of transport: by plane to Bratislava or Vienna (50km), by train, by ship and by car.
