



"Federation"



Frame

"Federation"

A federated body formed by a number of nations, states, societies, unions, etc. each retaining control of its own internal affairs.



Alternative Frame

"Convention"

A meeting or formal assembly, as of representatives or delegates, for discussion of and action on particular matters of common concern.





Convention

In order to achieve its aims, FIMM may:

- take decisions which, except as otherwise provided, shall be binding in some matters on all the members;
- b. make recommendations to members; and
- c. enter into agreements with members, non-member national or international organisations.

New legal and constitutional structures for FIMM?



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FIMM aims (acc. to the current statutes)

- to promote scientific research in the field of Manual Medicine,
- to develop standards for Manual Medicine in Quality management,
- to promote CO-Operation between its members,
- to harmonise pre- and postgraduate **education** in Manual Medicine in the various countries,
- to support the foundation of scientific Societies and legal representation for Manual Medicine in all countries,
- to represent the interests of Manual Medicine in its dealings with official authorities and organisations on an international level.



Alternative aims

- 1. to achieve the highest sustainable educational und organisational standard...
- 2. to contribute to expansion on member-level the process of development of MM Medicine on a strictly non-discriminatory basis...
- 3. to contribute to the expansion in the world the process of development of MM Medicine...



FIMM Way of working (Alternative)

Agreements, standards and recommendations

Discussions at FIMM committee-level sometimes evolve into negotiations where member societies agree on guidelines on such as science, education, health policy etc.

Publications

FIMM publications are a prime vehicle for disseminating the Federation's intellectual output. FIMM publishes regular outlooks, annual overviews and comparative statistics.






Depuis le 1er juillet 2003, tous les actes des personnes morales (associations, entreprises, etc.) paraissent dans cette annexe du Moniteur belge. Du fait de l'introduction de la Banque-carrefour des Entreprises (BCE), la procédure de publication pour les associations est devenue identique à celle des entreprises. C'est la raison pour laquelle il a été décidé de publier à partir du 1er juillet 2003 les actes des associations avec ceux des entreprises dans une seule annexe.

L'annexe, que vous pouvez ouvrir ici, rassemble donc les publications parues jusqu'au 01/09/2002 dans le recueil spécial des actes relatifs aux sociétés commerciales et agricoles et celles parues jusqu'au 30/06/2003 dans le recueil spécial des actes des ASBL, associations internationales et organismes d'intérêt public.

Cette publication a par conséquent un caractère officiel.

International Associations Under Belgian Law

As of 1987, the only specific arrangements which exist to provide regal status to international non-governmental organizations as such are those resulting from the Belgian law of 25th October 1919 conscious international associations with "scientific objectives". This was modified by the law of 6th December 1954 which extended it to international associations with "philanthropic, religious, scientific, artistic or educational objectives". The text of the law is as follows.

Law of 25th October 1919 on International Associations with Scientific Objectives

Albert, King of the Belgians, To all those powent and to come, Greetings: The Chambers have adopted and we sanction the following:

Art. I Personal civil states may be granted by Royal decree under the conditions and within the limits of the present law to associations open to Belgians and to aliens which have as executive a permanent institution or committee with its seat in Belgium with an administration including at least one Belgian member and which, without profit motivation, follow a scientific objective.



Belgian Seat

- Strong historical reference
- Disadvantage:
 - No active Belgian FIMM membership
 - Language obstacles
 - Complicated procedure


